4.0 Audit & Finance Committee - D. Cunningham

- **4.1 November 2024 Financial Statements** L. Farrell reviewed with the Committee the significant items of the long form financial statements for November 2024.
- Accounts Payable did increase by our monthly approvals related to the funds that are sent over the to EDC.
- On the Operating Fund, there is a \$25,000 grant for Workforce Development. When we closed on the GSOPP Route 262 Solar project they also funded their \$25,000 grant to the LDC which is for Workforce Development and/or the general economic development program support. This will show up on Strategic Investments next time we look at that.
- The other monthly activity for other funds, normal monthly activity. MedTech Centre expenditures we are at about 92% of the budget or a little bit over for insurance and the rest are on track for budget.
- MedTech Centre expenses are at 92% of budget for most line items, which is where we would anticipate being at this time. Insurance is known to be over budget.
- On the income statements, there is normal monthly activity.

4.2 Lease Extension with GCC for MedTech Facility – The GGLDC has a lease with GCC for the second floor at the MedTech Centre. This lease is set to expire in August of 2025. The GGLDC and GCC wish to enter into an amendment to the existing lease to extend the term out ten years, with an option for another 5 year period. If they do not wish to extend the term for that five year period, they must declare so two years prior to the expiration of the initial ten year term. The lease rate has remained the same and the base year used to calculate the CAM charges is the 2024 rate of \$4.70 per square foot.

D&O Insurance Renewal

In December, Lawley Insurance received notice that Travelers would be non-renewing the D&O and Employment Practices coverage due to loss history and exposure/nature of operations.

Lawley Insurance has provided us with a proposal from Fireman's Fund Indemnity Corp. The proposal reflects a price of \$29,177.57 which would be split 50/50 between the GCEDC and GGLDC. This is an overall price increase of \$1,023.57 (\$511.78/entity) compared to the current policy. The current policy expires on 2/23/2025.

Lawley did send our information to market, but no other quotes were offered. The marketing results are included in the proposal.

The cost of this policy (2/23/25-2/23/26) would be split between GCEDC and GGLDC (\$14,588.79/entity). The annual D&O insurance expense per entity would be \$14,503.46. Each entity included \$14,300 in their 2025 budget for this expense.

Cyber Insurance:

Travelers is willing to renew the Cyber insurance coverage.

The proposal reflects a total price of \$7,706 which would be split 50/50 between the GCEDC and GGLDC. This is an overall price increase of \$401 (\$200.50/entity) compared to the current policy. The current policy expires on 2/23/2025.

The cost of this policy (2/23/258-2/23/26) would be split between the GCEDC and GGLDC (\$3,853/entity). The annual Cyber insurance expense per entity would be \$3,819.60. Each entity included \$5,000 in their 2025 budget for this expense.
